

For twenty years, Raul Tuset has been instrumental in initiatives of corporate change, strategy development, and implementation of policy.

Raul was part of the design and launch of the Danone Leadership College in South America, Asia, the U.S., Australia, New Zealand, and Europe, a project that resulted in substantial leadership enrollment. He mobilized the middle management level of Cone Health's leadership, leading to the non-profit's inclusion in the top percentile of U.S. healthcare systems as measured by national patient care standards. In another engagement, Raul led a course in Spanish for 800 employees of a pharmaceutical plant in Puerto Rico as part of a company-wide initiative to re-establish itself with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.



Raul has dedicated much of his life to the prevention of drug abuse and the development of programs for troubled youth. His work includes overseeing joint projects with the National Institute of Drug Abuse and the Multicultural Resource Center, directing the first halfway house for delinquent boys and girls under the auspices of the Division of Youth Services of the State of Massachusetts, and advising the Chairman of the Arkansas Juvenile Justice Advisory Group on the redesign of the state's programs for troubled youth.
